- Admission is \$17 for adults / \$15 for seniors and children ages 2-11
- Both walk around and drive thru sections of the park are open and included with admission.
- Cash and cards are accepted.
 There is a 4% fee on all card transactions.
- It takes approximately two hours to see the whole park.
- Everyone must exit the park by 5:00 p.m.





- Keep your windows either ALL the way up or ALL the way down.
 Zebras can bite and break your windows.
- Feet must be inside the vehicle at all times. You may ride in the bed of a truck, but the tailgate must remain closed for the entirety of the drive.
- Stay on the path at all times.
- DO NOT FEED zebras or donkeys. They have upper and bottom teeth and can bite!
- You may keep your Feed Cup and refill it for \$1 on your next visit. If you do not wish to keep it, please return it to a desk or Return Bin. Do not throw it away or on the ground.
- Use and disperse your feed wisely. There are many animals in the back pastures of the Drive Thru. Save some feed for them too!
- Be courteous to other drivers who may not have as much time as you. Pull over to get the perfect picture.
